

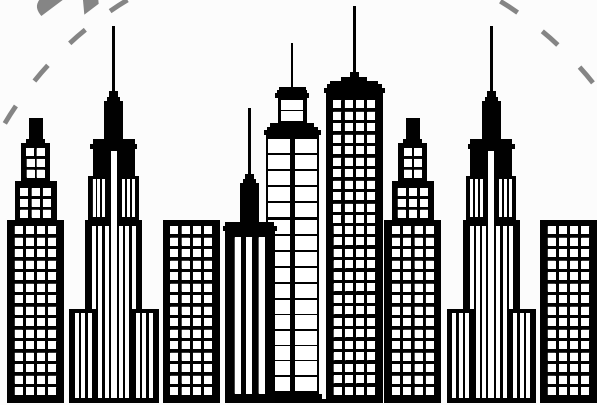


Primary-aged children learn that they can describe where they live in different ways. They learn that they don't just live in a home, but also belong to a neighborhood, city, state, etc.

This activity will help learners visualize the relationships between the different locations that describe where they live.

Directions:

1. Print out pictures on the following pages and have your learner cut out the circles.
2. Glue or tape the picture of the United States on the circle that says, My Country.
3. Glue or tape the outline of NY State to the to the circle that says My State and the outline of the NYC skyline to the circle that says my city.
4. Write the name of your borough, on the circle that says, My Borough.
5. Have your learner practice writing their address on the circle that says, My Address.
6. Finally have them draw a picture of them self on the circle that says, Me.
7. Thread a piece of string through the circles as the top of each larger circle- and have your learner flip through the circles to describe where they live.

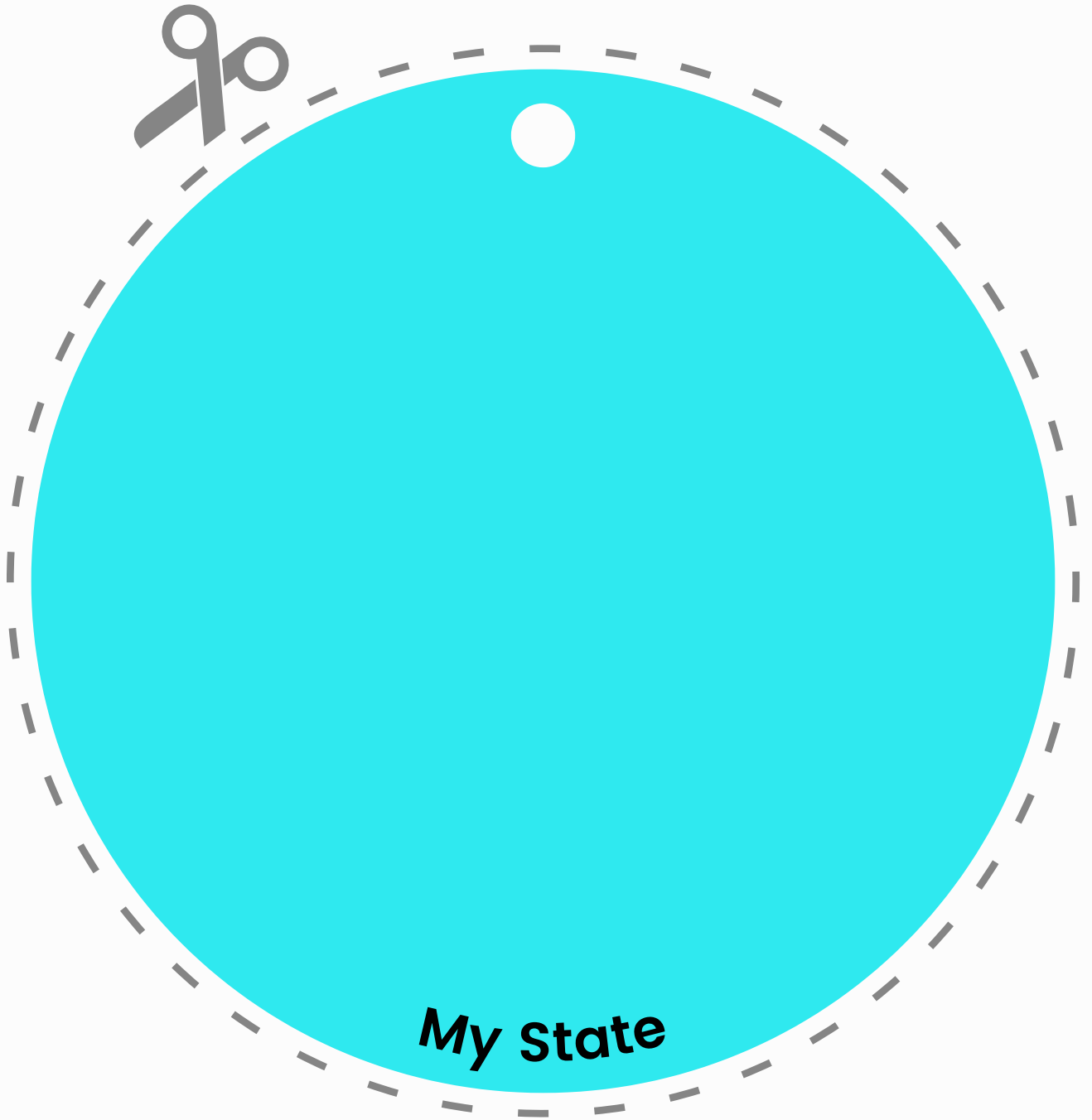
